REPORT FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

In my first report to you I will try to be brief.

First of all I would like to say how happy I am to be back working and living in Niagara Falls. My wife and I were both born and raised here. Being able to work in a field that you enjoy is a pleasure; being able to do so in your home town is a joy.

My first task upon arriving was the preparation of budgets for the United Way campaign. These have been completed and have gone through an initial review by the United Way panel. We are awaiting a final review and approval. We have also been involved with the reviews of all program budgets with representatives of the Ministry of Community and Social Services. All programs are being held to maximum increases of eight per cent (8%) increases in subsidy, and there is no guarantee that we will receive even that much. It is imperative that the Board and members increase the active membership and be prepared to engage in on-going fund raising activities if we hope to maintain our current levels of service. The days of "...get it from the Province..." are just about over. If we, as an association, want to maintain control over existing programs, and the power to develop new services, we must be prepared to pay for it. We've done it before, we can do it again!

It was felt by the Board of Directors that it was necessary to develop an identity for the Association as being more than just one program (i.e. ARC or Harmony). As a result, they decided to locate

the administrative offices of the Association at a location other than in one of the existing facilities. We have been fortunate to obtain office space at 4625 Ontario Avenue, just north of Queen Street, immediately behind Thorburns Drug Store. The telephone number is 357-5606. We should be all moved in and functioning by the end of May. We will send out a formal announcement at a later date. I have been working out of ARC Industries since my arrival on March 17; and would like to take this opportunity to thank all the trainees and staff at ARC for their gracious welcome and patient tolerance. In particular I would like to thank Wanda and Allana for their typing and retyping, copying and re-copying, and all-around assistance.

I hope to meet as many of you as possible at the next General Meeting on June 23rd.

Reg and Gwen are working in a restaurant, washing dishes. They take the city bus to work.

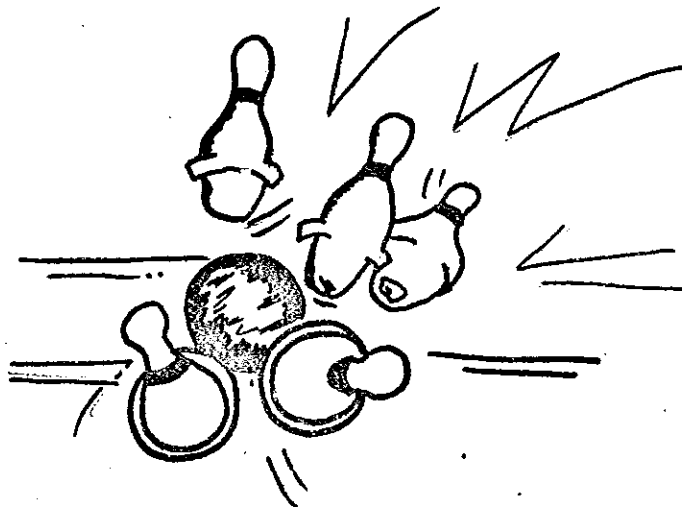

David's girlfriend is in the hospital for an operation, she is feeling a little weak.

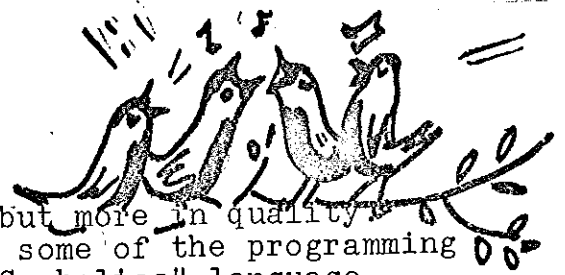

RESIDENTIAL SERVICES REPORT

Spring has finally arrived and both residents and staff are busy enjoying the accompanying seasonal activities - gardening, outings, planned vacations, etc. We are fortunate in again receiving Federal Funding for a Summer Youth Employment Program. This Grant will provide three students to operate special programs within the Residences. One student will be recruiting and organizing volunteers and planning recreational activities at the Children's Residence. Another will work with the Adult residents on self-improvement skills and crafts. The third summer staff will be working with some of the Adults to do repairs, maintenance and woodworking (at both Residences). It looks like a fun, productive summer with all the extra hands.

For families planning vacations and intending to use the parent relief beds, please book your time as soon as possible. We have some openings left and hope to avoid disappointing anyone. Even if we cannot accommodate your son or daughter for the required time, there are other Parent Relief Programs in the Region which we can refer you to.

KALAR ROAD RESIDENCE 357-0433 (1 relief bed)

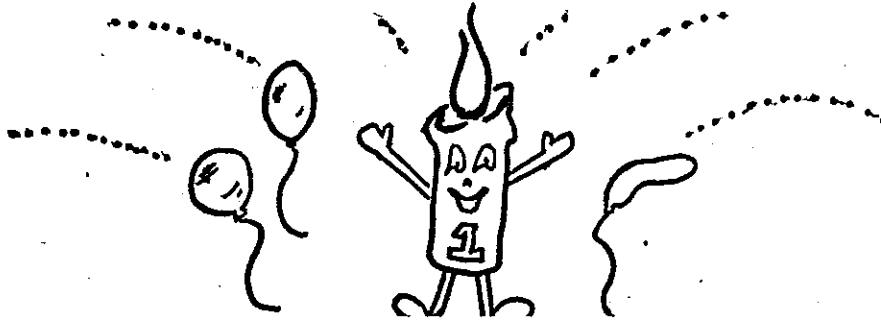
An alternative to using the Residences for your son or daughter would be to use HEALTH CARE SERVICES - UPJOHN LTD. Most families have coverage for Private Duty Nursing (eligibility does not require a medical problem) under Medical or Extended Health Care Section of their Employee Group Insurance Plan, This coverage can be used to provide assistance in caring for a developmentally

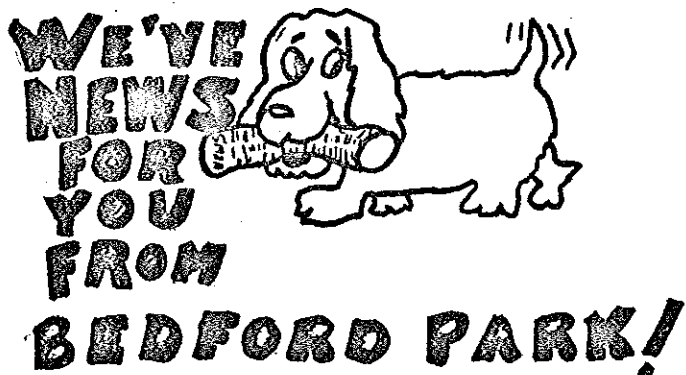
handicapped child or adult in your own home. Parents wishing assistance for an evening out, hospital stay, holiday, etc., may find "UPJOHN" able to provide the necessary relief staff. "UPJOHN" provides: R.N.'s, R.N.A.'s, R.N. Assistants, Nurses Aides, Home Health Aides and Homemakers. They undertake the necessary staff training, orientation and matching to ensure the needs of the specific client are met. The agency has provided staff relief to families with Mentally Retarded Children with good results.

Donna will check into your insurance coverage to see if there would be a cost to you in using this service. She will also assist you in obtaining a referral from your family doctor, if necessary. 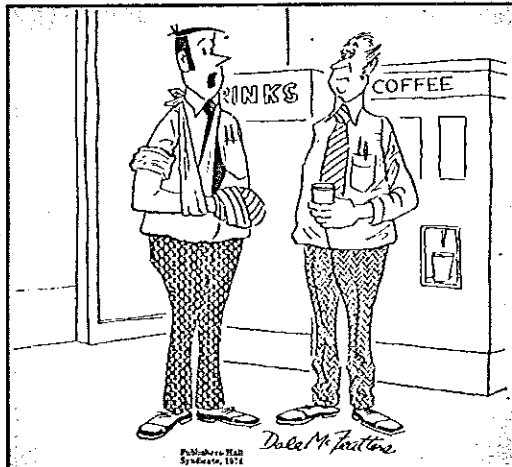

NOTICE OF AMENDMENT

It has been recommended by the Executive Committee at a meeting on April 29, 1980.

"To amend General By-Law No.1, Section 20, subsection C, by adding parargraph-3. Association Membership may be granted to anyone who is a staff member of this Association or any related Association for the Mentally Retarded. Associate members will be accorded all rights and privileges except those of voting, serving on the board of directors, or becoming an officer of the corporation. This is the only class of membership that may be granted while a person is in the employ of this, or any other, Association for the Mentally Retarded."

This recommended amendment was approved by the Board of Directors on May 20, 1980, by a unanimous vote of twelve (12) directors present and voting; and, referred to the General Membership for ratification at a General Meeting to be held June 23, 1980, at 7:30 P.M., at Brights Wines Ltd., 4887 Dorchester Rd., Niagara Falls, Ontario.
